## A Word From Your Pastor...

Joe Harding told about a young man who heard the circus was coming to town. He saw all the posters, and so he faithfully saved his money so that he could attend. Finally the day for the circus to come arrived. The young man rushed down to Main Street and saw the parade of clowns, lions, acrobats and the band. When the parade was over, he walked up to the circus master and paid his money and went home. It was not until years later that he learned the circus was held in a big tent at the edge of town, and he had settled for the parade and missed the circus.

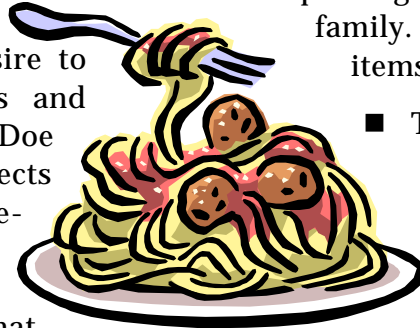

## Mission News

### *CROP Walk for World Hunger*

Doe Run will be steppin' out to stop hunger in this year's Community CROP Walk. We'll join with nearly 20 other churches in the area in this fun community outreach event – helping local Chester County food cupboards to feed the needy locally, and helping to feed the hungry worldwide through Church World Service. Last year 351 CROP Walkers from 17 churches raised over \$18,450 for this good cause. Members of Doe Run walked along the Struble Trail in Downingtown side-by-side with neighbors throughout the community to raise money in the fight against hunger. But that fight goes on.

Did you know that, in a March 2004 survey by the Pennsylvania Hunger Action Center, of over 500 pantries and cupboards that responded, on average, each pantry or cupboard served 137 households over the course of the month – up from 121 households during March 2003 and 110 households during March 2002? The increases – 10 percent from 2002 to 2003 and 9 percent from 2003 to 2004 – strongly suggest that the risk of hunger is affecting a widening swath of Pennsylvania households.

Food pantries here in the heart of Chester County echo that continued need for support. Dozens of families come in weekly to receive enough food to care for their children, appreciative that the food cupboard doors are open to them as they struggle through difficult times. Won't you join us for this year's CROP Walk? Together, we can make a real difference. Please support the walk by sponsoring your favorite CROP Walker with a generous donation to help feed the hungry.

# Reflections

*from the Journal of Mary Carlin*

October 9, 1919

Old dear, it was a beautiful and a wonderful night. The invitation to Helen's party came Tuesday morning and after trying all day to find some dancing men, Leah McMinn, Martha Uxley and I went together. And such a time as we did have! Dancing was of course the feature of the evening but we also sang and some of the girls played the piano. The refreshments were delicious. The party was intended for a surprise but Helen knew all about it.

Well, I danced and danced and danced and oh, how I did enjoy it. All those men were very good dancers and I had my share of dances with all of them except Mr. McCune, and more than my share with Ira. I love to dance with him. In fact, I thoroughly enjoyed every dance. We danced until 1:20. Ira took me home, rather to Leah's where I stayed all night. Leah and I never went to sleep until fully three O'clock and then I dreamed I was dancing until next morning. Edson came for us



and took us to work. I did enjoy the whole experience so much!

Among the men I tried to invite to my party was Walter Carlin. He couldn't go to the party so he fixed things up by taking me to movies last night. I met him in Coatesville at eight and we caught the 10:15 trolley home. The moon was almost full and the night was perfectly beautiful. We talked until 11:20 when Walt left to catch the trolley. I enjoyed the evening, altho' I did not care much for the picture. Acceptances of my party invitations are coming in and I'm sure we will have a wonderful time. I had a letter from Clarence Miller this afternoon and he has accepted my invitation and is coming up next Wednesday for the purpose of becoming "better acquainted."

My party will be Leah's farewell party as she is leaving Coatesville for Claymont the last of this month.
