On Sunday, October 3, we will celebrate **World Communion Sunday** a day when Christians from around the world gather in worship to share bread and wine in memory and celebration of the death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The day has taken on a new relevancy in a time when fear divides God's people on this earth. On this day we celebrate our oneness as People of God in Jesus Christ and renew our commitment to work for justice and peace in a world deeply divided by conflict and war. Also on this day, Presbyterians throughout the world collect the *Peacemaking Offering* which supports varied peace-focused projects both in this country and the world. Please give if you can to these efforts to bring Christ's peace into the world.

Interesting Fact: World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) originated in the Presbyterian Church (USA). In 1936, for the first time, the first Sunday in October was celebrated in Presbyterian churches in the United States

and overseas. From the beginning, it was planned so that other denominations could make use of it and, after a few years, the idea spread beyond the Presbyterian Church.

A prayer for World Communion Sunday

O God of majesty, as we gather today to worship you, disquiet us and your whole creation with your peacemaking Holy Spirit quietly insisting, "Know justice, know peace." As your Son broke bread and gave it to thousands, so call us anew to a peace marked by a just distribution of your abundance, until that day when no one shall hunger nor thirst any more; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord we pray. Amen.
